Plan with other partners as early as possible

Have speakers from NTD endemic countries - to bring depth to the conversations

Ensure it is participatory! And design the activities to ensure those new to the area are able to get involved as much as those familiar with it

Collaborating with cross cutting group/s to get the most diverse content, from multiple organisations and perspectives.

Involve persons affected / from the ground Have a good team of facilitators A lot of the workshop will depend on the speakers that you have for the session.

Speakers can make or break your workshop. You want someone who knows what they are talking about and also engaging.

Multidisciplinary collaboration with innovation at the heart of it.

It need to align with conference goal

Make the interactive part playful

Make the participation central.

Not an afterthought or q&a.

Use what you learn from the discussion and make sure participants can also follow where their suggestions go

Effectively engage a new / often neglected constituency (eg the YOUTH)

An interesting task for the breakout group to really work together on - 6-8 in a group and encourage a facilitator
